Portland Victoria

Portland is the site of the earliest European settlement in Victoria. Portland Bay was named by British navigator James Grant who sailed along the Victorian coast in the Portland was named after the Duke of Portland and is the only deep sea port with safe anchorage between



Adelaide and Melbourne. Edward Henty and his family migrated from England to W.A. in 1829 and then settled in Van Diemen's Land and after a voyage of 34 days in the Thistle, arrived in Portland Bay on 19th November 1834. In early December Henty, using a plough he constructed himself, was the first person to turn a sod in Victoria. The next voyage of the Thistle brought his brother Francis with additional stock and supplies and

soon buildings and fences were constructed. Edward was only 26 at the time. Their old family home Burswood is still in existence in Portland.



The Henty's had extensive pastoral interests in the Casterton district centred on their head station Muntham where the old homestead still exists in fine order. Participants in the Strathalbyn tour may recall travelling up the long Muntham Hill with the old homestead and station buildings in the valley north of the road.

Portland is the hub for our winter tour and is a charming and progressive regional centre with a number of historic sites and early buildings. It has a fine harbour and maritime discovery centre.
